Questions	Answers
<p>1 Name two rules you should follow as a pedestrian.</p>	<p>Choose from:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • wear bright colored clothes • walk on a sidewalk if one is present • walk facing traffic if a sidewalk is not present • use a flashlight at night • walk don't run when crossing the street • always hold a child's hand when crossing the street or in a parking lot • cross the street at a corner or in a crosswalk • walk with others • children shouldn't walk after dark • stop at the edge of a street or driveway and look left-right-left for traffic before crossing
<p>2 What should you always do before riding your bicycle?</p>	<p>Put on and buckle your helmet</p>
<p>3 What should you always do before crossing the street?</p>	<p>Stop at the curb or edge of the road and look left-right-left for traffic. Cross when no traffic is present.</p>
<p>4 What can you do to make yourself more visible to others?</p>	<p>Choose from:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • wear bright colored clothes • wear reflective items • use a flashing light on your backpack • use a flashlight at night • walk in areas that are well lit
<p>5 Name two bike safety rules.</p>	<p>Choose from:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • act like a vehicle on the roadway • follow all the same rules of the road as motorized vehicles • always wear a bicycle helmet • always make sure your family and friends wear a bicycle helmet every time they ride • ride in the same direction as motorized traffic • do not ride on sidewalks where it is not permitted • wear bright colors during the day so others can see you • wear reflective materials in low light conditions (dusk, dawn, fog, rain, etc.) • children should not ride bicycles at night — if they must, then use a white front light.
<p>6 You are walking and talking on your cell phone and have to cross the street. What should you do?</p>	<p>Hang up or put the person on hold while you pay close attention to traffic. You should not continue your conversation until you are safely out of the roadway.</p>
<p>7 When do you wear a bicycle helmet?</p>	<p>Every time you ride your bicycle</p>
<p>8 Why should you walk, not run when crossing the street?</p>	<p>You could trip and fall which could cause you to get hit, drivers are less likely to see you if you enter the road suddenly.</p>

<p>9 Name something to consider when selecting a safe route to school.</p>	<p>Choose from among routes that have:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • sidewalks present • pedestrian crossings, signals, or school crossing guards • streets with lower speeds • few lanes to cross • a refuge island • wide shoulders if no sidewalk is present <p>Avoid routes that include walking through or around vacant lots or buildings.</p>
<p>10 What side of the road should you walk on if a sidewalk is not available?</p>	<p>If a sidewalk is not available, always walk on the left side of the street (or facing traffic)</p>
<p>11 Left without your bicycle helmet fastened, go back home and adjust your helmet properly.</p>	<p>Not applicable.</p>
<p>12 Name a way you can set a good example as a bicyclist.</p>	<p>Examples include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • wear a properly fitted bicycle helmet every ride • obey traffic signs and signals • give pedestrians the right of way or yield to pedestrians • ride in the same direction as motorized traffic • obey pedestrian signals if crossing the street in a crosswalk
<p>13 Name a way you can set a good example as a pedestrian.</p>	<p>Examples include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • wait for the signal to change or walk with the pedestrian signal • always walk on the sidewalk if one is present • walk facing traffic if a sidewalk is not present • encourage your friends to follow safe pedestrian behavior • look left-right-left for traffic before crossing a street • look for traffic while crossing the street • hold children's hands when crossing the street
<p>14 Who should follow pedestrian rules?</p>	<p>Everyone who walks around motorized traffic (cars, trucks, buses, and motorcycles) and non-motorized traffic (other people walking, bicycles, those on skates, skateboards, etc.) should watch out for others and follow the rules to keep themselves safe.</p>
<p>15 True or False? Bicyclists should follow the same rules of the road as motorists.</p>	<p>True. Bicyclists are considered vehicles and should follow the same rules of the road as motorized vehicles. Rules include: riding in the same direction as traffic, obeying all traffic signs and signals, and being courteous to other road users.</p>
<p>16 Name two ways a safe routes to school program can benefit your school.</p>	<p>Choose from:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • less traffic around schools • less pollution around schools • children will think better at school if they walk and bike • children will reduce their carbon footprint by walking and biking more • children will have more fun together doing this program
